

Over the next two weeks, our school is focusing on one of our core values— KAITIAKITANGA. Attendance

Last year, 67% of our students had regular attendance, meaning they attended school more than 90% of the time. This year, our target is to increase that to 70%. Our long-term goal is to reach the Ministry of Education's target of 90% regular attendance by 2027. Ensuring tamariki are at school every day is vital for their learning and success.

Matipo School 2025 Assessment and Reporting

I wanted to provide an update on assessment and reporting at Matipo for 2025.

- e-asTTle Reading & Writing: Used across the school to assess student progress and inform next steps in literacy.
- BSLA (Better Start Literacy Approach): Implemented in the Junior School to track foundational literacy development.
- Phonics Assessments: Conducted at 20 weeks and 40 weeks for Junior School students to monitor early literacy progress.
- PAT Assessments: Covering reading comprehension, listening, grammar & punctuation, and mathematics to provide robust data on student achievement and next steps.

These assessments will be used to inform teaching practice, guide targeted support, and ensure we are effectively meeting student learning needs.

Reporting Changes:

In line with the government's new requirements, our reporting will now occur in Term 2 and Term 4. To make these reports as meaningful and valuable as possible for whānau, I'd appreciate your feedback on what information you find most useful. This will help us streamline the reporting process, removing unnecessary workload for teachers so they can focus on what truly matters—teaching and learning.

CHANNELS OF COMMUNICATION

CLASSROOM TEACHER

Classroom teachers are with their class for the entire school year and should be your first point of contact for any questions or concerns regarding your child's learning and wellbeing. They take the roll twice a day and share daily notices with students each morning. They also teach core subjects such as reading, writing, and maths. Each teacher is responsible for their own class in these key learning areas, ensuring consistency and connection in learning. If your child has any concerns, whether academic, social, or emotional, their classroom teacher is the best person to approach first.

TEAM LEADER

Each teaching team has a designated Team Leader who provides leadership in planning, assessment, behaviour management, and communication with whānau. They support teachers in their team and oversee team-wide events, such as EOTC (Education Outside the Classroom), class trips, and other key activities. Team Leaders also provide support for any matters that a classroom teacher may need additional guidance with.

LEARNING ASSISTANTS

Our Learning Assistants provide support for students with diverse learning needs. They work alongside teachers to assist students in their learning, whether supporting small groups, individuals, or whole-class activities. Their role is essential in ensuring that all tamariki have access to high-quality learning experiences tailored to their needs.

DEPUTY PRINCIPAL/SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS COORDINATOR (SENCO)

Our SENCOs are the Deputy Principals, they ensure that students with additional learning needs receive the necessary support and guidance to thrive at school. This may include developing tailored learning programmes, connecting students with internal or external support services, or assigning a Learning Assistant where appropriate. Our SENCOs works closely with classroom teachers and whānau to create the best learning approach for each child.



Regular Communication with our Whānau

School Newsletter

Our school newsletter will be published every even week (Weeks 2, 4, 6, 8, and 10). This will include important whole-school updates, key events, and celebrations of learning across the kura. The newsletter is a great way to stay informed about what's happening at Matipo School.



Board Update

The Board of Trustees will provide a community update once per term, outlining key decisions made in alignment with the school's strategic direction. In addition, Board meeting minutes will be available seven days after each meeting and can be accessed via the school website. This transparency ensures that our whānau are well-informed about governance matters and the school's long-term planning.





Class HFRO Posts

Classroom teachers will post updates every alternate week to the school newsletter, keeping you informed about classroom learning programmes, key highlights, and important reminders. These updates may include:

- Notices about specialist programmes such as Food Technology (including a reminder for tamariki to wear covered shoes).
- Library days and the importance of returning books on time.
- Special class events or excursions.

These updates ensure whānau are connected to their child's learning journey.

These posts will highlight key dates, school-wide initiatives, and any other relevant information to help you stay up to date with what's happening at Matipo.

Emergency Drills at Matipo School

Throughout the year, we will conduct regular fire and lockdown drills to ensure that all students and staff are familiar with our emergency procedures. These drills help us stay prepared and respond effectively in an emergency.

- Fire Drill: If the fire alarm sounds (a continuous bell), everyone must evacuate the buildings immediately and assemble on the school field. Staff will guide students to safety and conduct roll calls to ensure everyone is accounted for.
- Lockdown Procedure: In the event of a lockdown, an announcement will be made over the school bell system. Students and staff must remain indoors, follow teacher instructions, and ensure that doors and windows are secured until further notice.

By practicing these procedures, we can ensure a calm and safe response in real situations.


